**CITY COUNCIL NEWS****City Council Meeting: September 11, 2024**

Council:

- Approved the September 3, 2024 Beach Parking Workshop Minutes and the September 5, 2024 Audit Selection Committee minutes.
- Consensus to change the dates of the audit selection timeline.
- Tabled the first reading of Ordinance No. 2024-03 until the September 23, 2024 meeting.
- Approved the first reading of Ordinance No. 2024-05 setting the millage rate for Fiscal Year 2024-2025 to 5.5168.
- Approved the first reading of Ordinance No. 2024-06 adopting the Annual Operating and Capital Budget for Fiscal Year 2024-2025.
- Adopted Resolution No. 757 increasing specific building, recreation and vacation rental fees.
- Authorized the City Manager to accept the Preferred Government Insurance Trust renewal bid for \$435,226.55 for Fiscal Year 2025's liability, property, workers' compensation, public safety life and executive travel life insurance coverages.
- Adopted Resolution No. 758 enacting the Fiscal Year 2024-2025 Employee Pay and Classification Plan.
- Tabled discussion and establishment of the Council's legislative priorities for 2025 until the September 23, 2024 meeting.

Council:

- Approved the Fees and Employee Benefits Workshop minutes and the Regular Council Meeting minutes.
- Accepted the Fiscal Year 22/23 Annual Financial Report as presented by Berman Hopkins CPA's and Associates LLP.
- Tabled the review of the revised draft noise ordinance, Ordinance No. 2024-03, to the August 13, 2024 meeting.
- Approved setting the maximum millage rate for FY2024/2025 at 5.5168.

City Council Meeting: October 22, 2024

Council:

- Approved the September 23, 2024 meeting minutes.
- Consensus to hold a special meeting on December 19, 2024 at 6:00 pm to approve a construction contract for the Algonquin Sports Complex.
- Approved the first reading of the Revised Noise Ordinance No. 2024-03 with modification to Section 8-13, subparagraph 6 from 65 decibels to 60 decibels.
- Approved the second reading Ordinance No. 2024-07 increasing the DROP maximum participation period of the Police Pension Plan from three years to five years.
- Authorized the City Manager to sign the agreement with PCI Municipal Services with effectiveness of agreement contingent upon amendment of Chapter 19 Code of Ordinances, Sections 19-22 and 19-23.
- Approved first reading of Ordinance No. 2024-09, Fiscal Year Capital Project Roll Forward Budget Amendment.
- Approved the recommendation by the Tree Preservation Board for the adoption of a City policy to follow best practices in the care of trees on public property.
- Approved the Audit Selection Committee's ranking of proposals for audit services and authorized staff to begin negotiations with the top-ranked firm, Carl, Riggs & Ingram, governing board for the South Beaches coalition.
- Decided to not award a contract for the 2nd floor City Hall security upgrade and defer the project until Fiscal Year 2026 due to the cost and lack of a second bid.
- Adopted the Fiscal Years 2025-2029 five-year Capital Improvement Plan.

POLICE DEPARTMENT'S CHRISTMAS OUTREACH

The Holiday Season is fast approaching. We are preparing for the Annual Indian Harbour Beach Police Department's Christmas Outreach Program. This is a unique and personal program, unlike any other, that allows the police department and community of Indian Harbour Beach an opportunity to work together to truly make a difference for IHB families and senior citizens during the holiday season. This is how the Christmas Outreach Program works: School Resource Officer Jennifer Imperato (Officer Jen) works with Ocean Breeze Elementary School to identify Indian Harbour Beach children whose families may have had a challenging year and are struggling to provide Christmas gifts for their children. Once a family is identified, Officer Jen will contact the parents to obtain the child's "Christmas Wish List." If there are, other children in the household, they will be included.

Officer Jen, with help from other members of the police department, shops for items on their "list." These items often include clothing, shoes, bikes, and school supplies. We also identify senior citizens who may need assistance. In these cases, a gift card is purchased from the store where they buy their medication, food, and medical supplies.

The second part of the program, and my favorite, is the Food Pantry. Several businesses and schools organize a food drive to collect food for the Food Pantry. All collected food items are placed in the Police Department Training Room. When families pick up the wrapped gifts to put under their Christmas tree for their children, they can choose from the donated food items to ensure they have all the fixings for their Christmas Dinner, which includes a turkey.

What truly makes this program so special is the fact that this program is funded entirely by Indian Harbour Beach citizens and businesses. All the money donated goes directly towards purchasing Christmas gifts and food items to assist Indian Harbour Beach's underprivileged families and senior citizens. Last year, with your help, we provided Christmas gifts for 37 children from over 17 different

families and assisted ten senior citizens. Each family could take several bags of food home to assist with their food needs for the remainder of December. The remaining food collected was donated to local churches to help with their Food Banks. Any remaining money collected will be used the following year or throughout the year to help needy families.



GOLF CART AND LOW SPEED VEHICLE REMINDERS

The City is working partnering with the SCTPO to work to decrease transportation related accidents so please remember.

- It is against the law for golf carts and low speed vehicles to operate on sidewalks and bike paths in the state Florida.
- Golf cart drivers under 18 must be at least 15 with a learner's permit or 16 with a driver's license.
- Low speed vehicles are legally able to operate on roads with speed limits up to 35 miles per hour and Golf carts are limited to speeds under 20 miles per hour and can only be driven on roads with a maximum 30 miles per hour speed limit.


