CITY COUNCIL MEMBER HAMILTON BOONE PASSES



It is with great sadness that we announce the passing of Council Member Hamilton "Ham" Boone on January 9, 2025. He was a cherished husband, father, veteran, medical professional, and advocate for individuals with disabilities.


Originally from Eau Gallie, Ham Boone entered the Marines shortly after graduating High school in 1967. Hamilton Boone, being a patriotic man enlisted in the military. Proudly serving his country as a U.S. Marine.

Afterwards, Ham went to school to continue his education, obtaining his Bachelor's degree in biology from Georgia State University and then going and getting his post graduates degree as a Physician's Assistant (PA) from the Medical College of Georgia. After graduating, Ham practiced at medical centers across the country and in 1989 developed and instituted a new P.A. practice model in Atlanta that provided surgical PAs to hospitals and surgeons. But Ham didn't stop there, he continued his

contributions in the medical field and was recognized by Central Florida's VA Regional Medical Center for his contributions to disabled veterans through the coaching and teaching of Adaptive Training.

Ham, then continued his service to others found time to serve our local community through volunteering and community engagement which eventually led him to becoming a City Council Member right back where he grew up. He was involved and always bringing up new topics and pushing for positive change in the community. Always involved, Ham attended City Council Meetings virtually when mobility issues prevented him from coming to City Hall. **CITY COUNCIL NEWS****City Council Meeting: November 19, 2024**

Council:

- Approved the October 22, 2024 meeting minutes with a correction.
- Accepted the resignation of Susan Ruimy from the Tree Preservation Board and authorized staff to solicit resumes for the newly created vacant position.
- Presented out-going Council Member Shauna Hume with a plaque and thanked her for her service.
- Ratified the 2024 Municipal Election results for Seat #3.
- Swore in newly elected Seat #3 Council Member Susan Ruimy.
- Reappointed Scott Nickle as Mayor.
- Reappointed Frank Guertin as Deputy Mayor.
- Appointed Deputy Mayor Guertin as the representative to the South Beaches Coalition of the Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization.
- Appointed Council Member Adam Dyer as the voting delegate to the Space Coast League of Cities, and Mayor Nickle as the alternate voting delegate.
- Appointed Council Member Ruimy as the Satellite Beach Library Board liaison.
- Adopted Ordinance No. 2024-03: Revised Noise Ordinance.
- Adopted Ordinance No. 2024-09: FY25 Capital Project roll forward budget amendment.
- Adopted Resolution No. 760: Noise measurement process.
- Approved the replacement of two (2) Police Department vehicles via state contract procurement.
- Classified the Fire Department's 1995 E-one Pumper Truck as surplus and authorized selling it via an online auction.

City Council Meeting: December 10, 2024

Council:

- Approved the November 19, 2024 meeting minutes as presented.
- Received a presentation from Management Analyst Orrie Covert on the findings from the second annual resident informal survey.
- The consensus of Council was to transition to Corcoran Partners as the City's lobbyist effective January 1, 2025 for a period of six (6) months and evaluate their effectiveness and either decide to continue with them as the City's lobbyist or seek an alternate lobbyist.
- Adopted Ordinance No. 2024-10 updating the Capital Improvements Element of the Comprehensive Plan.
- Adopted Ordinance No. 2024-11 establishing a paid parking program for non-residents at City operated beach parks.
- Awarded a three-year agreement with Carr, Riggs & Ingram, LLC for audit services, with two (2) one-year optional renewals, authorizing the City Manager to sign the engagement letter for FY25, and authorized the transfer of \$9,900 from the City Manager's contingency account to cover the budgetary overage.
- Awarded a contract, not to exceed \$298,000, to Atlantic Development of Cocoa, Inc. for the DEP ARPA grant-funded Alhambra Street stormwater project.
- Awarded a contract, not to exceed \$858,000, to Atlantic Development of Cocoa, Inc. for the DEP ARPA grant-funded Atlantic Boulevard stormwater project.
- Awarded a contract, not to exceed \$140,000, to Garcia Civil Contractors, LLC for the DEP ARPA grant-funded Ronnie Drive bioswale project.
- Authorized staff to approve a contract with FLOCK Group, Inc. for a two-year seven-camera security service at Gleason Park with 5 cameras, and 1 camera each at Bicentennial Beach Park and Millennium Beach Park and transfer \$29,000 from the City Manager's contingency account to fund the first year's cost.
- Classified the 2003 Ford Ranger Truck and five (5) lawnmowers as surplus and authorized their sale via an online auction site.

THE CITY'S PAID BEACH PARKING PLAN FOR NON-RESIDENTS

The City Council has approved Paid Beach Parking for non City residents. PCI Municipal Services will be the vendor that the City will be partnering with for parking services. PCI Municipal Services is a professional parking management firm solely focused on municipal parking management. The PCI team specializes in working with municipalities to deliver a quality parking experience for their residents and visitors. PCI has worked with municipalities across the state of Florida to deliver great customer services and parking solutions.



Details of Indian Harbour Beach's paid beach parking plan are as follows:


- Residents can register their vehicles and receive a free annual pass.
- Hourly Parking Fees - \$3.00 per hour / \$15 all day rate
- Pay at the kiosk on site or through your phone.
- Parking Hours: 6 AM - 10 PM
- Non-Payment Citation - \$50 fine / increases to \$100 fine if unpaid after 14 days. Parker pays 15 (all day parking rate) plus the fine amount due. Parker will owe \$65 if issued a parking fine for non-payment. Parker will owe \$115 if citation remains unpaid after 14 days.



GOLF CART AND LOW SPEED VEHICLE CORRECTION

According to Florida State Statute 316.212, "Golf Carts" may only be operated on roads that have been approved by the state, the county or the municipality. At this time, there are no municipal or state streets/roads in the City of Indian Harbour Beach that have been approved for the operation of "Golf Carts". However, under Florida State Statute 316.2122, the operation of a "Low Speed Vehicle" may be operated only on streets where the posted speed limit is 35 mph or less. "Low Speed Vehicles" must meet the following standards:

- 1) Four wheeled vehicle whose top speed is greater than 20 mph but not greater 25 mph.
- 2) Must be equipped with headlamps, stop lamps, turn signals, tail lamps, reflectors, parking brakes, rearview mirror, windshield, seatbelts, and a vehicle identification number.
- 3) "Low Speed Vehicle" must be registered, insured, and titled in accordance with Florida State Statutes 320.02 and 319.
- 4) The operator of the "Low Speed Vehicle" must have in their possession a valid driver license.



A MESSAGE FROM THE FIRE DEPARTMENT

We all know that parking in a fire lane is illegal. Yet, many citizens do just that every day. How many times have you driven to one of our local shopping centers and found someone in a car sitting in the fire lane? In fact, it seems that more and more drivers are ignoring the law and creating access issues for our emergency responders. It is our intent to make everyone aware of this growing concern and prevent any avoidable incidents due to illegal parking or stopping of non-emergency vehicles.

“NO PARKING, FIRE LANE” means just that. Not even for a minute . . .

The space outside of a business is not a loading zone if it is designated as a Fire Lane. Driver's must use the proper designated Loading Zone for loading and unloading. The Fire Lane is not a special parking space for the disabled, nor is it a place to wait for passengers to exit the building. There are proper parking spaces dedicated for your use that are safer than improperly using the Fire Lane and hindering emergency response and access.

Whenever there is a fire or related emergency, police, fire and ambulances need to have proper access so that the vehicles can get close enough to the buildings for rescue, firefighting and medical response. By parking in that designated lane, inconsiderate drivers are preventing emergency response vehicles from being able to see appropriate connections to building fire protection systems and gain access to their designated area to perform necessary emergency functions in a timely manner.



For the safety of our citizens, our city ordinances also prohibit parking in the following locations:

- Within fifteen (15) feet of a fire hydrant, whether the curb is marked or not.
- Within twenty (20) feet of a crosswalk at intersections.
- Within thirty (30) feet of a stop sign, or traffic signal on the side of the road.
- Within twenty (20) feet on the side of the fire station driveway entrance, and within seventy-five (75) feet of the fire station entrance on the opposite side of the road.

Parking illegally is a violation of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Indian Harbour Beach and is punishable by civil penalties (fines). These fines can range from \$50-\$125, depending on the circumstances.

Please do yourself and your community a favor and park appropriately- it will protect you, other drivers, pedestrians, and your wallet.

RECREATION SWIM LESSONS & SWIM TEAM

Swim classes begin June 2 for children ages 6 months through teens, ranging from Mom & Tot through Competitive Swimming.

Registration for I.H.B. begins March 3; non-residents may register beginning April 7. No registrations will be taken by phone. Fees per 2-week session: I.H.B. residents - \$65; \$60 for each sibling. Non-residents - \$70; \$65 per sibling. Classes fill up quickly; register early to secure the class times you want. NO REFUNDS will be given.

Additionally, registration for the summer swim team is the same as our summer swim classes. The cost is \$125 for I.H.B residents and \$150 for non-residents. Fees will include at least two swim meets, ribbons. Swimmers must have completed Level 3 or advanced preschool and are not members of a year around swim program in order to participate on the summer swim team.


