**CITY COUNCIL NEWS****City Council Meeting: January 14, 2025**

Council:

- Approved Council Member Adam Dyer to participate in the meeting by phone.
- Acknowledged the passing of Council Member Hamilton Boone and stated their appreciation of his service to the community.
- Approved the Regular Council Meeting minutes from December 10, 2024.
- Approved the Special Called Meeting minutes from December 19, 2024.
- Tabled the appointment of a Tree Preservation Board voting member to the January 28, 2025 Council Meeting.
- Agreed to hold the first budget workshop on March 4, 2025; the FY26-30 Financial Model and Capital Improvement Plan review on April 22, 2025; and the FY26 Budget Review Workshop on August 12, 2025.
- Authorized staff to advertise the vacant City Council Member Seat #2 for the unexpired term ending in November 2026 by posting on January 17, 2025 with the deadline for submitting resumes to the City Clerk on February 14, 2025, and Council selection on February 25, 2025.

- Was introduced to the new Public Works Grounds Supervisor, Quincy Smith.
- Received the Tree City USA plaque.
- Approved the proposed Advisory Board Application to be used.
- Accepted Patricia Ferguson's resignation from the Tree Preservation Board.
- Removed from the table the appointment of residents to the vacant voting member positions for the unexpired term ending on March 11, 2025 and March 11, 2026.
- Appointed Leigh McElroy as a voting member to the Tree Preservation Board with a term ending March 11, 2025.
- Appointed Paul Oliveri as a voting member to the Tree Preservation Board with a term ending March 11, 2026.
- Approved the request from the Tree Preservation Board for a budget not to exceed \$1,200.00 for the 3rd Annual Arbor Day celebration.

City Council Meeting: February 11, 2025

Council:

- Approved the January 28, 2025 Regular Council Meeting minutes.
- Accepted the EMS grant award from Brevard County in the amount of \$6,240.30 for emergency medical services training and supplies.

- Approved the proposal for donated beach cleanup stations at the City's Beach parks.

The City of Indian Harbour Beach welcomes its newest City Council Member, Mr. David Nutt. Council Member Nutt was selected by the City Council to serve as City Council Member for seat #2 at the February 25th City Council Meeting. Council Member Nutt was sworn in at the March 11th City Council Meeting where he officially became a full voting member of the Council.

BEACH PARKING INFORMATION

On March 31, 2025, the City of Indian Harbour Beach will begin paid beach parking for non-residents at Bicentennial and Millennium Beach parks. The City will be using PCI Municipal Services (AKA Park IHB) to administer the non-resident paid parking program. The City's two beach parks will be outfitted with beach parking signs that allow visitors to pay for their parking spots through their mobile devices, and kiosks that allow visitors to pay in person. Rates to park at Indian Harbour Beach's beachside parks will be \$3 per hour or \$15 for the entire day. The City's beachside parks are open from 6 A.M. to 10 P.M. seven days a week. Non-residents who do not pay the parking fee will be issued a citation by Park IHB. There will not be any "booting" of vehicles for non-compliance.

Residents of Indian Harbour Beach can register their vehicle(s) for free parking by going online to <https://www.parkihb.org/>. Residents will need to provide acceptable proof of vehicle registration and residency. Residents denied free parking registration may appeal the decision to the Indian Harbour Beach City Manager John W. Coffey, ICMA-CM. Written requests for an appeal must include: Copies of all documentation that was provided, their name, phone number, email address, and a short explanation of why the person believes he/she qualifies for free beach parking.

Requests for appeals shall be emailed to Ngold@indianharbour.org or dropped off in paper form at Indian Harbour Beach City Hall, 2055 South Patrick Drive. Decisions shall be made within five business days of receipt of all required information.

The City will host an in-person sign-up day on March 28th from 9 A.M. - 3 P.M. where residents can visit City Hall and sign up for free parking. The system is based on scanning vehicle license plates similar to the Satellite Beach program with the key difference that no vehicles will ever be booted. The City will also hold outreach events at Millennium and Bicentennial beach parks on March 20th & 29th to answer questions about the program.



HELMET SAFETY

Did you know that wearing a helmet can reduce the risk of head injury by 85%? Keep your ride safe and stylish by ensuring you wear your helmet properly every time you ride.

To ensure your helmet fits properly follow the “2 V 2 RULE”!

- Your helmet should cover the top of your forehead and rest roughly TWO fingers width above the eyebrows.
- Next, adjust the sliders on the helmets side straps to form a V shape under and slightly in front of your ears.
- Lastly, buckle the chin strap until you can fit TWO fingers between the strap ad your chin.



TURTLES RETURN



It's turtle nesting season and that means until October the Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission asks you to practice the following regarding beachside lighting:

Keep it LOW - Fixtures should be mounted as low as possible while still serving their intended purpose. The bulb must produce the lowest wattage/lumens necessary for that purpose.

Keep it LONG - The lamp or bulb must emit only long-wavelength light (560 nm or greater), which includes amber, orange, or red colors.

Keep it SHIELDED - The fixture must be designed to direct light completely downward. Additionally, it must shield the bulb, lamp, or glowing lens from exposure to the beach.

The Florida Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission's Certified Wildlife Lighting incorporates all of these three rules.

FIRE DEPARTMENT UNDERGOES EMERGENCY MEDICAL TRAINING

The Indian Harbour Beach Fire Department is training its firefighters as Emergency Medical Responders to better serve our residents and community when a critical medical incident occurs. Fire Chief David Lewis requested to host the training for the department and was approved by the Florida Department of Health and the National Registry of Emergency Medical Technicians. The intensive training is expected to be completed by this summer and the fire department will be integrated into the EMS response network that serves our city. Chief Lewis, who is also a paramedic, has taught numerous courses throughout his career. The Melbourne Beach Fire Department is also participating in the training.

RECREATION SWIM LESSONS & SWIM TEAM

Swim classes begin June 2 for children ages 6 months through teens, ranging from Mom & Tot through Competitive Swimming.

Registration for I.H.B. residents begins March 3; non-residents may register beginning April 7. No registrations will be taken by phone. Fees per 2-week session: I.H.B. residents - \$65; \$60 for each sibling. Non-residents - \$70; \$65 per sibling. Classes fill up quickly; register early to secure the class times you want. NO REFUNDS will be given.

Additionally, registration for the summer swim team is the same as our summer swim classes. The cost is \$125 for I.H.B residents and \$150 for non-residents. Fees will include at least two swim meets, ribbons. Swimmers must have completed Level 3 or advanced preschool and are not members of a year around swim program in order to participate on the summer swim team.

Please note that swimmers will need to be able to swim multi-lengths of the pool. Ages are 5-15.


