

ALGONQUIN SPORTS COMPLEX UPDATE



In May, work began on an estimated six-month expansion project that will build:

- A synthetic turf multi-purpose field
- Two basketball courts
- Two tennis courts
- Four pickleball courts
- Children's playground equipment
- Eight-stall restroom building (four men's and four women's)
- Walking trail
- Improved parking
- Vehicular access connectivity between Osceola Drive and Crespino Court
- Two water retention ponds to safeguard the health of the Indian River Lagoon and help recharge the aquifer
- Security cameras
- Site reserved for a future baffle box to improve the health of the Indian River Lagoon
- Sites reserved for future amenities
- Expanded gated storage area for the Public Works Department (dumpsters will no longer sit in the parking lot)



After completion of the above items, the following tasks will be accomplished:

- The walking trail will be extended through the western portion of the complex
- A pedestrian/bicyclist access point in the northeastern corner to Verbenia Drive
- Landscaping and a vegetative buffer along the eastern and southern sides of the expanded portion complex will be landscaped
- Benches, trash cans, and recycling receptacles will be installed

**CITY COUNCIL NEWS****City Council Meeting: February 25, 2025**

Council:

- Issued a proclamation naming March 2025 as Irish American Heritage Month.
- Police Chief David Butler presented the 2024 Officer of the Year award to Corey Stacy.
- Approved the Regular Council Meeting minutes from February 11, 2025.
- Appointed David Nutt to fill the unexpired Council Member Seat Number Two position with a term expiring in November 2026.

City Council Meeting: March 11, 2025

Council:

- Approved the Regular Council Meeting minutes from February 25, 2025.
- Approved the FY26 Budget kickoff workshop minutes from March 4, 2025.
- Accepted the resignation of alternate Planning and Zoning Board Member David Nutt and authorize staff to advertise the vacant Planning and Zoning Board member position.
- Council Member Select David Nutt was sworn in to the unexpired Seat #2 with a term ending in November 2026.
- Informed that Victim Advocate Tiffany Petro was awarded the 2024 Victim Advocate of the Year award for the State of Florida.
- Agreed to hold a workshop on May 13th at 5:30 p.m. (prior to a Council meeting).
- Adopted criteria for residents' free parking at the City's beach parks.
- Re-appointed Ms. Leigh McElroy to a voting membership position on the Tree Preservation Board with a term expiring March 11, 2028.
- Accepted Mr. Kenneth Bowman's resignation and authorized staff to solicit for resumes for the newly created vacant position on the Tree Preservation Board.
- Approved renewing the Interlocal Agreement for the Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization.

City Council Meeting: March 25, 2025

Council:

- Issued the 2025 Arbor Day proclamation.
- Approved the Regular Council Meeting minutes from March 11, 2025.
- Postponed the City Manager's annual evaluation until July to give newly appointed Council Member Nutt sufficient time to evaluate the City Manager's performance.
- Approved installing signage along the dunes on our beaches and draft an ordinance to prohibit dune disturbance that includes a citation penalty system.
- Authorized staff to engage the services of BlueSky Restoration for future emergencies.
- Awarded a contract not to exceed \$390,000.00 to Adrian Turnbaugh Construction, Inc. for the transportation capacity improvement projects to the Yuma Drive and Osceola Drive east sidewalks.
- Awarded a contract not to exceed \$57,000.00 to Sun Surfaces of Orlando, Inc. for the resurfacing of the pool at the Recreation Center and authorized staff to transfer funding from the City Manager's Contingency Account to cover the overage.
- Approved the Memorandum of Agreement in which Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) delegates the authority to the City of Indian Harbour Beach Police Department to perform certain immigration enforcement functions.
- Authorized staff to notify Brevard County of the City's intent to increase the Stormwater Utility Assessment rate in FY26 as required by the 2024 interlocal agreement between the City and Brevard County.

Council:

- Introduced Chris Lewis, the newest Police Officer.
- Issued a Proclamation naming the month of April as Water Conservation Month.
- Approved the Regular Council Meeting minutes from March 25, 2025.
- Appointed Ms. Linda Jimeian to the unexpired alternate position on the Planning and Zoning Board with a term expiring September 30, 2025.
- Approved designated Low Speed Vehicle (LSV) parking at the City beach parks and awarded a contract to Adrian Turnbaugh Construction in the amount not to exceed \$8,700.00 to install Low Speed Vehicle (LSV) parking spaces at the City beach parks.
- Awarded a contract not to exceed \$60,000.00 to Atlantic Environmental to relocate eight (8) gopher tortoises from the Algonquin Sports Complex.

YARD WASTE COLLECTION REMINDER

- Small branches, leaves, grass clippings, small yard waste piles, and palm fronds must be placed in your 96-gallon yard waste cart. (no small piles on the ground/street, please)
- Please DO NOT bag your yard waste. Bagged yard waste is not accepted at the Brevard County Landfill.
- All Indian Harbour Beach residents are provided with one-96 gal. cart for garbage, one 96-gallon cart for yard waste, and one 96-gallon cart for recycling. If you do not have a yard waste cart or would like to purchase an additional cart, please contact Waste Management.
- Brevard County ordinance NO. 94-49 states that hired landscaping, land clearing, or tree trimming services must remove any vegetative waste they generate on residential and commercial properties.
- Waste management will not pickup any form of construction waste. Such waste is to be disposed of by the reasonable party at the nearest dump site.



**A MESSAGE FROM IHYPD**

The police department recently received several questions about Florida's Vehicle Tint Laws. Florida allows for the following tint on vehicle windows.

It is hard to know exactly what these percentages look like. In an effort to assist the community, Indian Harbour Beach residents can stop by the Police Department, on any Tuesday (TINT TUESDAY), between 9-4 and our Victim Advocate will utilize a tint meter to measure your window's tint to ensure it is within allowable parameters. This service is free.

For more information on the Florida Law about vehicle tint refer to Florida State Statute 316.2953.

**DID YOU KNOW?**

- Florida Law allows for an exemption for certain medical conditions, see FSS 316.29545
- Mirror or highly reflective tint is prohibited.
- Violation of the tint law is considered a non-moving violation with a fine of \$119.00

PREPARING FOR HURRICANE SEASON

As many readers know, we are in the midst of hurricane season, and that means making sure that you have an up to date plan as well as all the things you may need in the event of a hurricane.

Before a Hurricane

- Stay up to date with local announcements by either TV, radio, or online.
- Shutter or board the windows in your home.
- Secure outdoor objects or bring them inside.
- Stock up on food and water in case you must take shelter.
- Make sure your car has fuel in case an evacuation is ordered.
- Turn off utilities at the main valves or switches if instructed.

During a Hurricane

- Take refuge on the ground floor in a small central room or hallway.
- Get under the table or similar strong object.
- Keep away from windows and glass doors.
- Close all inside doors. Brace all outside doors.

After a Hurricane

- Remain in a secure location until you are notified that it is safe to leave.
- Do not drive unless necessary.
- Do not drink tap water until authorities say it's safe.
- Stay away from waterways until potential flooding has passed.
- Report downed power lines and broken gas and sewer mains to officials.
- Inspect your home for damage.
- Report any damage to your insurance agent.



Hurricane Evacuation

Evacuate before you are told if...

- You live in a mobile home.
- You live in a high-rise
- You live on the coast or near water.
- You feel you may be in danger.

If an Evacuation is Ordered

- Leave at once.
- Bring your disaster supply kit.
- Follow advised evacuation routes.
- Keep away from coastal areas or inland water.
- Let others know your plans.

The City of Indian Harbour Beach swimming pool will begin its summer hours on Monday, June 2. Annual pool memberships are available for families or individuals. Daily fees for IHB residents are \$2 for youth (under 18) and \$3 for adults. Non-resident daily fees are \$4 for youth and \$6 for adults. Please keep in mind that during the fall/winter/spring months there are usually lanes available for lap swimming during General Swim time. However, for the summer months this is generally very limited.

STAY COOL!



When the outside temperature is 85 degrees, after just 10 minutes the temperature in a car can climb to 104 degrees, after 20 minutes to 114 degrees, and it keeps climbing. This is known as the Greenhouse Effect.

Heatstroke is a condition caused by your body overheating, usually a result of prolonged exposure to or physical exertion in high temperatures. Heatstroke can occur if your body temperature rises to 104F (40 C) or higher. Children and the elderly are at the greatest risk of heatstroke.


