CITY COUNCIL NEWS

April 22, 2025 FY26-30 Financial Model & Capital Improvement Plan and Regular Council Meeting

- Received a presentation from City Manager John W. Coffey, ICMA-CM on the FY25-29 Capital Improvement Plan Acknowledged the promotion of Police Sgt. Shadrack Carter to Police Lieutenant.
- Issued a proclamation for the 56th Annual Municipal Clerks Week.
- Approved the April 8, 2025 Regular Council Meeting minutes.
- Agreed that a stop sign in place of a red yield sign located at Harbour Drive West and Bay Drive East (which becomes Shore Lane) would be a positive change and would improve safety in the area.
- Agreed to cancel the June 10th meeting due to the Council Chamber being used for the Special General election.
- Awarded a contract not to exceed \$75,000.00 to RVi Planning + Landscape Architecture, Inc. for planning services related to an update of the City's Comprehensive Plan.

May 13, 2025 Fire Department needs and Code Enforcement workshop & Regular Council Meeting

- City Manager Coffey introduced Angie Dollens, the City's new Comptroller, to Council.
- Received a presentation from Fire Chief David Lewis to discuss the Fire Department current challenges and future needs.
- Received a presentation from Fire Chief David Lewis to discuss Council's desired level of service for Code Enforcement, which the most common code issues are boats, tall grass/wildflowers, hedge height, trash and signs.
- Council issued a 2025 Memorial Day proclamation.
- City Manager Coffey presented the 2025 Employee of the Year award to Fire Chief David Lewis.
- Approved the Workshop minutes from April 22, 2025.
- Approved the Regular Council Meeting minutes from April 22, 2025.
- Authorized City Manager Coffey to execute the proposed interlocal agreement with the City of Satellite Beach for automatic aid for fire protection and rescue services.
- Awarded a contract not to exceed \$42,000.00 to ArborPro, Inc. for the grant funded tree inventory services project and authorized staff to transfer the required budget from the City Manager's contingency account.
- Approved Resolution No. 762, Authorizing Certain City Officials as Signers on the City's Banking Institution Accounts for the City of Indian Harbour Beach.

May 27, 2025 Regular Council Meeting

- Issued a Space Force Day Proclamation.
- Approved the May 13, 2025 Workshop minutes.
- Approved the May 13, 2025 Regular Council Meeting minutes.
- Approved the second reading and adoption of Ordinance No. 2025-01 approving Fiscal Year 24-25 mid-year budget amendments.
- Approved the second reading and adoption of Ordinance No. 2025-02, relating to the protection of coastal sand dunes.
- Approved the first reading of Ordinance No. 2025-03 extending the franchise agreement with Waste Management.
- Awarded the milling, paving, and striping contract not to exceed \$123,000.00 to Goodson Paving, Inc. and approved the transfer of the balance of the project budget to the Algonquin Sports Complex Expansion project.
- Adopted the FY26 mail out notice of the stormwater utility assessment rate of \$90.00 per Equivalent Residential Unit (ERU) to be provided to all property owners ahead of the August 12th public hearing to adopt the rate and assessment roll.
- Authorized the City Manager to execute the Memorandum of Understanding for reimbursement of up to \$74,500.00 for a School Resource Officer at Ocean Breeze Elementary School for School Year 2025-2026.

LOW SPEED VEHICLE WORKSHOP

The City of Indian Harbour Beach will be having a workshop at 6 PM on Tuesday July 29th in the City Council Chambers at City Hall. The workshop will review the City's current policy, compare the policies of other communities, and develop clear guidance regarding low speed vehicles. Members of the community are encouraged to attend the meeting and provide input on what they would like to see the City do on this topic.



CODE ENFORCEMENT CHANGES

The City of Indian Harbour Beach stepping up its oversight and enforcement on property maintenance, nuisance, health, and safety codes.

City leadership is reviewing the top issues our staff has previously had difficulty enforcing and is making necessary recommendations to ensure what written in the municipal city code is desired, proper, and enforceable. These top code issues include boat, trailer, and recreational vehicle parking, overgrown grass and vegetation, and improper signs.

Our ultimate goal is voluntary compliance. City staff want to work with cooperative, responsible homeowners to achieve quick resolutions to any outstanding code issues that may be out there. Existing code violations that do not pose an imminent threat to health, safety, or welfare or imminent destruction of habitat or sensitive resources will be given until November 10, 2025 to be brought into voluntary compliance. Following our Code Enforcement processes, general violations will receive a Courtesy Notice in late October / early November those violations that remain uncorrected beyond the stated timeline will be formally addressed with a written Notice of Violation and strict, progressive action, up to and including bringing issues before a Special Magistrate.

Residents may report code violations either by submitting a form that is available from city hall or the City's website www.indianharbourbeach.org or through the City's See Click Fix App <https://seeclickfix.com/indian-harbour-beach>. All complainants must provide their name, address, and phone number or email. Per Florida statute 162.06(b), code enforcement proceedings may not be initiated by way of anonymous complaint unless the issue poses an imminent threat to public health, safety, or welfare or imminent destruction of habitat or sensitive resources.



NATIONAL STOP ON RED WEEK

The Space Coast Transportation Planning Organization will observe National Stop on Red Week, which runs Aug. 3-9, 2025.

Created by the Federal Highway Administration and spearheaded by the National Coalition for Safer Roads, National Stop on Red Week aims to educate drivers about the dangers of red-light running and to reduce the number and severity of crashes. The Insurance Institute for Highway Safety found that motorists in urban areas are more likely to be injured in crashes involving red-light running than in any other type of crash.

In 2023, 84 people were killed, and an estimated 681 people were seriously injured in crashes that involved red-light running in Florida. The U.S. Department of Transportation found that one in three Americans know someone who has been injured or killed in a red-light running crash.

One light. One rule. Lives saved.



ELECTION INFORMATION

The City of Indian Harbour Beach will hold an election on Tuesday, November 4, 2025 to fill Seats #4 (currently held by Deputy Mayor Frank Guertin) and #5 (currently held by Mayor Scott Nickle) for a three (3) year term. This will be the last of the 3-year terms for Council Members. Starting with the 2026 election, all council members will be elected to a four-year term.

To qualify, a candidate must be a registered voter who has resided in the City of Indian Harbour Beach for at least one (1) year prior to the date of qualifying. Candidates must submit signed nominating petitions with a minimum of 67 signatures from registered Indian Harbour Beach voters and submit a qualifying fee of \$30. Candidates will file qualifying paperwork with the City Clerk during the qualifying period, which will start at noon on Thursday, July 31, 2025 and will end at noon on Tuesday, August 12, 2025.

A person may announce their candidacy prior to official qualifying by meeting with the City Clerk and filing the Appointment of Campaign Treasurer and Designation of Campaign Depository for Candidates form. Until this form has been filed, campaign funds may not be collected or disbursed, or petitions signed. Please contact Sue Frank, City Clerk for additional information, or to schedule a time to meet with her.

State law requires candidates for municipal office to comply with state regulations and accounting instructions for candidates and committees as set for in Florida Statutes.



Daily fees for IHB residents are \$2 for youth (under 18) and \$3 for adults. Non-resident daily fees are \$4 for youth and \$6 for adults. Please keep in mind that during the fall/winter/spring months there are usually lanes available for lap swimming during General Swim time. However, for the summer months this is generally very limited.
