## NATIONAL NIGHT OUT & FLORIDA CITY WEEK


The Indian Harbour Beach Police Department will once again be hosting “National Night Out.” National Night Out is a night for our Nation to stand together and promote crime awareness, safety, and neighborhood unity. National Night Out showcases the vital importance of police and community partnerships. It sends a message to criminals that our community is organized and will continue to work together to make Indian Harbour Beach one of the safest cities in America. When Law Enforcement and the Community work together, amazing things can and often do happen.



This year's National Night Out will be combined with Florida City Week, where the City of Indian Harbour Beach joins cities throughout the state in a weeklong celebration that raises awareness about the importance of municipal government and its daily impact on residents. With local government being the government closest to the people and the one with the most direct daily impact on its residents, it is important that residents understand how their city operates, the services it provides, and the importance of their active involvement. City staff from each of the City's departments will be in attendance to explain what they do and answer questions from the public. In addition, Indian Harbour Beach's own, Dano's Pizza, will be there selling their delicious pizza.

The event will be held on Wednesday, October 1, 2025, at Gleason Park from 6:30 pm until 8 pm. During this carnival-style event, there will be bounce houses, face painting, a pie-eating contest, a bike rodeo, and a Public Safety expo to including IHB Police and IHBFD vehicles.

We will once again be helping our Ocean Breeze Elementary School with needed school supplies. The entire event is free, we only ask that you donate an item to the school. Requested school supplies include: gift cards to OfficeMax/Office Depot, back packs, #2 pencils, glue sticks, dry erase markers, scissors, pencil cases, pocket folders, lined and plain paper, lined notebooks, blue and red pens, rulers, bottles of hand sanitizer, boxes of tissues, crayons-pencil-24 count- 48 count and washable markers.

## CITY COUNCIL NEWS

### June 24, 2025 Regular Council Meeting

- Issued an Aging Matters in Brevard Proclamation.
- Was introduced to the newest Police Sergeant, Tim Gannon.
- Approved the Regular Council Meeting minutes from May 27, 2025, as presented.
- Authorized Mayor Nickle to sign a letter of support for the continuation of the Justice Assistance Grant receipts being used by the Brevard County Sheriff's Office (BCSO) to continue providing prisoner transport for the Indian Harbour Beach Police Department.
- Approved Mayor Nickle to be the voting delegate for this year's Florida League of Cities Annual Conference.
- Rescheduled the July 16th Low Speed Vehicle workshop to July 29, 2025 in order for City Attorney Bohne to be able to attend.
- Tabled the 2nd reading and adoption of Ordinance No. 2025-03, Waste Management Franchise Agreement extension, to the July 8th Council meeting.
- Approved the 1st reading of Ordinance No. 2025-04, establishing designated parking spots for low-speed vehicles at Bicentennial and Millennium Beach Parks.
- Awarded a contract not to exceed \$150,000.00 to Brevard Construction Company for renovations to the Recreation Center Bathhouse and instructing staff to transfer \$69,196 from the City Manager's Contingency account to cover the overage.
- Awarded a contract not to exceed \$54,000.00 to Advanced Recreational Concepts, LLC via a piggyback contract from Clay County for the replacement of a playground unit at Oars & Paddles Park, and authorize staff to use the City Manager's contingency for the overage in the procurement of the installation services and mulch.
- Authorized staff to transfer \$20,669.00 from the City Manager's contingency to fund 0.46 Full-time equivalent part-time Maintenance Specialist II positions in the Fire Department through the remainder of Fiscal Year 25.

### July 8, 2025 Regular Council Meeting

- Added a discussion regarding a new veteran's statue in Gleason Park to the agenda.
- Received a presentation from RVi Planning + Landscape Architecture, Inc. on the Comprehensive Plan update project.
- Approved the Regular Council Meeting minutes from June 28, 2025, as presented.
- Agreed to hold a workshop on July 29, 2025, at 6:00 p.m. to discuss low-speed vehicles.
- Agreed to hold a workshop on July 29, 2025, at 5:00 p.m. to discuss South Patrick Drive.
- Removed from the table the public hearing and 2nd reading of Ordinance No. 2025-03, Waste Management Franchise Agreement extension, and included the Current Waste Management franchise agreement for discussion.
- Adopted Ordinance No. 2025-03, extending the Waste Management franchise agreement for five-years, with Waste Management providing monthly reports of complaints, as agreed to in the franchise agreement.
- Adopted Ordinance No. 2025-04, establishing designated parking spots for low-speed vehicles at Bicentennial and Millennium Beach Parks.
- Agreed to approve Council Member Ruimy soliciting a donation of a statue honoring veterans to be installed in the southwest portion of the walking trail in Gleason Park, and would like a camera installed aimed at the new statue.

### July 22, 2025 Regular Council Meeting

- Council issued a World Drowning Prevention Day proclamation.
- Council issued a Water Professionals Month proclamation.
- Approved the July 8, 2025 Regular Council Meeting minutes as presented.
- Agreed to hold the annual Board and Volunteer Dinner on Wednesday, November 19, 2025.
- Approved a maximum millage rate of 5.5099 for Fiscal Year 26.

## CITY COUNCIL NEWS CONTINUED...

- Awarded a contract not to exceed \$64,000.00 to Advanced Recreational Concepts, LLC via a piggyback contract from Clay County for the replacement of a playground unit at Gleason Park, and authorized staff to use contingency for the overage in the procurement of the installation services and mulch.
- Appointed Dr. Beth Mahoney to an alternate membership position on the Tree Preservation Board with an indefinite term.
- Determined the continued use of a 2011 Ford Crown Vic, 2017 Ford Explorer, two bicycles, two cargo boxes, and five automated external defibrillators as uneconomical, inefficient, and serving no useful function. Therefore, the best option for the City would be to declare said fixed assets as surplus and authorized staff to sell them via an online auction site to the highest bidder or other means of disposal.
- Accepted the summary results of the City Manager's one-year performance evaluation, and approved a 7% pay increase with an effective date to be retroactive to May 16, 2025.

### July 29, 2025 South Patrick Drive Workshop

- Agreed to make another request to FDOT for a signal warrant analysis at the Publix Shopping Center, and to let them know that this location is the hot spot in our City for traffic incidents.

### July 29, 2025 South Patrick Drive Workshop

- Agreed to ask for an Attorney General opinion on whether the City could create our own registration process for low speed vehicles, and if so, it would need to be similar to what the City of Satellite Beach adopted. They also agreed that they would like to make sure that the Satellite Beach City Council would be interested in allowing registered low speed vehicles to be reciprocal with each other.

## SCOTT NICKLE & NEIL YORIO CLAIM COUNCIL SEATS

The City of Indian Harbour Beach election season came and went last week as the City as the two open council seats that were open are now closed. Current City Mayor Scott Nickle ran unopposed and will retain seat #5 for another three year term on the City Council.

Alternatively, Council Member Frank Guertin chose not to run for his current seat. Which means Council seat #4 will go to Neil Yorio, who also ran unopposed this election cycle.

Neil Yorio currently serves as the lead Chairperson for the City's Tree Preservation Board and has done important work through the City's Tree Inventory Project, Arbor Day Celebration, Champion Tree Program, and more.

Neil Yorio will be sworn in and take on his duties as Council Member at the November 11th City Council Meeting.



## TEMPORARY POOL CLOSURE

The pool has been temporarily closed in order to complete essential repairs to the tile and deck. In addition, the bathhouse will undergo a complete renovation starting at the same time. This project will take longer, and as a result the bathhouse restrooms will be closed for an extended period. During this time, members will have access to the restrooms located on the east side of the recreation center. These repairs are part of our ongoing commitment to maintain and improve our facility, we truly appreciate your patience during this process. Irrigation days and hours are restricted by order of the St. Johns River Water Management District water conservation rules, and by City ordinance.

- Water only when needed and not between 10 AM and 4 PM
- Water for no more than one hour per zone.
- Restrictions apply to private wells and pumps, ground or surface water and water from public and private utilities.

Proper preparation and placement of yard waste help our team members work safely and keep your neighborhood clean.

WM will collect large, loose Yard Waste piles that are 3 cubic yards or more with a clam truck. Please refer to the attached map for your collection day. Your carted Yard Waste collection day will remain the same.

Additionally, please DO NOT bag yard waste. Bagged yard waste is NOT accepted at the Brevard County Landfill.


## SIGN UP FOR CITY NOTIFICATIONS




